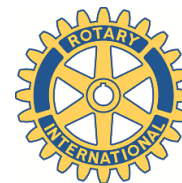

#### History

Professor Osborne, the Charter President of the Rotary Club of Melbourne, and the Extension Officer for Southern Australia, formed our Club at a meeting held on the 24th August, 1923 attended by eleven with four apologies. The first luncheon was held in the South Australian Hotel on Friday 31st August, 1923. There were 23 Charter Members with George McEwin, a solicitor, the first President and Rupert Haynes, Secretary.

The Club's Charter was signed by the R.I. President on 4th February 1924 and received by the Club in early March 1924.

A strong effort was made to increase membership as after 19 months, over 80 proposal cards had been issued.

During 1927 Rotary Districts were established in Australia. Our Club has been a member of Districts 65, 64, 33, 250, 950 - currently 9500.

Eight of our members have been District Governors.

There have been just over 1250 members of the Club to date. The

  - Business-in-the-Community and Bridging the Gap
  - Crippled Children's Association
  - Senior Citizens
- \$140,000 raised for Rotary Wing, Julia Farr Centre (1955) and Rotary House, Helping Hand Centre (1970).
- Over \$150,000 donated by the Club during 2006-2007 for various charities.
- Thousand of hours of service provided to community groups by members of the Club.
- Initiated ROMAC in SA and raised \$33,000 towards medical treatment under this programme.
