- Began exchange 18th Jan 41degrees and arrived to minus 12
- Stayed with same host family for whole year
- Host father and two brothers
- Chose course not subjects at school. Struggled because all lessons in Swedish.
- Now able to speak Swedish and understand some other Scandinavian languages.
- Max temp 26 degrees in Swedish summer.
- Eurotour in Swedish summer. 12 countries in three weeks
- 11 students from US staying in Denmark sent home for inappropriate behaviour. None from Australia or staying in Sweden sent home
- Sunbaking on 18degrees and swimming in 3 degree water
- 18th birthday in London. Visited uncle
- Favourite Budapest, climbing Alps and skinny-dipping in freezing water
- Exchange students became closest friends
- Host father, a lawyer, is treasurer of local Rotary Club and attended 4 meetings over the year
- Difference in culture. Swedes like more personal space, keep to themselves in public places eg bus stop
- Swedes keep quite healthy; exercise, eating habits, diet
- Swedes most loyal people you could ever meet
- Now more aware of difference and variety
- Not planning to go to uni until 35years old

- Plans to work and travel while still young, then to open own coffee and cake café.
- Then run cafe bar; a very intimate atmosphere for evening. Possible franchise or pop-up bars
