Guest Speaker— Doug Layng, Rotary Peace Fellowships

- Rotary Peace Fellowships Program Overview & Update
- Not that well-known, some exposure a few years ago.
- Up to 100 professionals chosen from around the world to receive fellowships to study at one of 7 peace centers around the world.
- Fully funded by Rotary International (tuition, fees, room, board, round-trip transportation, internship/ field study expenses)
- Master's Degree program: 15 to 24 months long and requires a practical internship of two to three months during the academic break
- Professional development certificate program: for experienced professionals and lasts three months with 2-3 weeks of field study
- Following completion, alumni has 36% in nongovernmental organisations, 15% in government agencies
- Applicants must meet certain criteria:
 - Proficiency in English
 - Second language recommended
 - Demonstrated commitment to international understanding and peace
 - Excellent leadership skills
 - Masters degree applicants must have minimum 3years related fulltime work or volunteer experience & bachelor's degree
 - Certificate applicants must have minimum 5
 years related fulltime work or volunteer
 experience, strong academic background
