# Driver program ticks all the boxes

A PROGRAM that has aided a host of young people in Gawler in their quest to obtain their driver's license has been named Gawler's Community Group of the Year.

Wheels in Motion was established in 2018 after the program was successful in obtaining a grant through Fund My Neighbourhood.

The program is aimed at supporting members of the community, age between 17 and 25, who do not have access to a car or a licensed, supervising driver.

Kirsten Impett, the program's administrator, was notified that Wheels in Motion had picked up an Australia Day award.

"It was a shock, I didn't know we were nominated," she said.

"It was a really nice surprise, I think I was half asleep.

"It is really nice to get the recognition for the mentors because they put in so much time, so much work and it is nice for the kids too..."

Since the program's launch, more than 40 young drivers have gained their provisional license through their participation in Wheels in Motion.

Difficulties in obtaining a driver's license was first identified as an issue by the youth of Gawler in 2017, who saw it as a key aspect in gaining independence and crucial for gaining employment.

Youth development officer Ebony Preece approached David Weatherly and the Rotary Club of Gawler Light for its assistance in getting the program off the ground.

Rotary is a supporter of the program, along with Peter Kittle Motors (who sourced the car), APM Services (who sponsor the program and individual participants), RAA and Café Nova.

The program also utilises professional driving instructor Keith Scott, of Keith's Driving School, who assesses each participant and mentor before they enter the program.

Mr Weatherly thanked Ms Impett, Ms Precee and Mr Scott for their work with the program's participants and for its implementation, and for the mentors who volunteer their time to support the young drivers.

He also thanked the individuals who nominated Wheels in Motion for an Australia Day award.

"Thank you very much for the nomination, it is really appreciated," he said.

"It recognises the work put in by a number of people over a period of time and I think the 40 participants have now gone through and got their Ps as a result of the program would thank them as well."
