<u>Guest Speaker:</u> Steve McLachlan—World's Greatest Shave

- Steve's beard and hair were shaved by Kelly as part of the World's Greatest Shave
- Raised at least \$1850.00
- In 2020, the Leukemia Foundation will celebrate 22 years of the World's Greatest Shave campaign. The World's Greatest Shave began back in 1998 is now one of Australia's biggest fundraising events.
- People of all ages shave, colour, or wax the hair on their head, chest or face – supported all the way by proud family, friends, colleagues and classmates
- Some have a personal connection to blood cancer, while others take part simply to have fun, tick a bucket list box and raise money for a good cause.
- More than 2 million Aussies have taken part over the past two decades, with an estimated 37,500 kilograms of hair removed!
- Leukemia, lymphoma and myeloma are types of blood cancer. Blood cancer and related disorders can develop in anyone, of any age, at any time.
- Every day another 41 Australians are diagnosed with a blood cancer. That's one Aussie every 36 minutes.
- Right now, more than 110,000 Australians are living with blood cancer or related disorders.
- Although research is improving survival, sadly up to 20 people per day lose their life to blood cancer in Australia.
- In many cases, treatment starts within 24 hours of diagnosis. If the person lives in rural or regional areas, the impact is even greater. They may need to relocate for months or years of treatment – leaving everyone and everything behind.
