<u>Guest Speaker:</u> Ian Curtis— Cambodia Village Grower Chicken Project

- Update and summary of Cambodian project
- Commenced with meeting with Duncan who had a vision and needed assistance to bring it to fruition
- Opportunity to empower women out of poverty
- Addressing biosecurity was an important issue
- 12 months trial
- KJC training Centre hatchery and rearing sheds
- Club supported concept as international project
- Club members raised funds plus a District grant which be received when completed
- Project must be compliant and expenses well documented
- Teacher at local school helped by translating at interviews
- Village outgrower selected—couple in mid 50s who own land
- Current income between \$50 70 US per month and motivated to increase earnings and willing to help others
- Very old Temple alongside project site
- Sheds that will be built will have tight biosecurity and will be solidly built
- Stocked with7 day old chickens which will each be grown to about to 1.3 kg
- Rotary loan will be repaid in 2-3 years
- Income will double to about \$1000 pa
- Solar panel/water purification world first
- Black chickens in high demand by locals
- Computer system to gather data via satellite
- Materials being purchased
- Growers training 16th- 30th March
- Financials all remitted by 15th March 2020
- RAWCS Project
- Some items going via DIK container
- Cool room on site to chill meat which is harvested with best practice
- Food security for Cambodia a goal that is being supported by their Government
- Creates income in the village through employment of 20-30 people
