Outgrower Project Update March 2020: Duncan Power

Training:

The first round of Outgrower training began on 23 March 2020, conducted on KJC Farm by the very capable KJC team.



A comprehensive training manual has been developed between KJC advisers and the local KJC Farm team for Outgrower farmers to take away and use for guidance throughout their training.

Farmers are given support and mentorship throughout the training on KJC, and throughout the project on their own farms.



Site Preparation:

Construction on Mr. Soung Sokon and Ms. Som Nerm's outgrower shed is underway and will be completed before the training is complete.



All labour and resources for the build are being sourced from the local community, adding further impact to the project.



Construction:

The shed has been carefully designed and adapted based on learnings from our pilot farm.

It is constructed from readily available local materials, and designed for optimum effectiveness within the local environment taking into account factors such as temperature and sun and wind direction.

Wheels in Motion – an insight by Rotarian Grant

Wheels in Motion is a significant part of my brief journey with Gawler Light. I find the ongoing situation with which we all face very mentally challenging and uprooting. Now I find the time that I would usually spend with the Wheels in Motion Program needing to be filled with other activities, which I struggle to find. I therefore find myself reflecting on this relatively new program and what it means moving forward.

Whether stuck calf deep in mud, coming to rest amidst plastic bollards or being asked the question, "Do you want me to turn here?" (when there is no street to turn into), the Wheels in Motion program has indeed made a significant difference to youth as well as myself. The enlightening stories shared confidentially during the drive have revealed the incredible hardship and challenges faced by many participants and reveal a precious insight into how this program helps these youth in their continued embrace to break free. For me personally I continue to be significantly challenged on my life's journey through mental health issues and enormous workload stress, but when I sit beside participants, I put this to one side, knowing every hour behind the wheel for these participants makes a huge difference. There are times to off-load black humour and times to encourage through a positive mindset - especially to those who find the journey with learning to drive a car an enormous challenge for a host of confidential reasons. We rejoice together at milestones such as birthdays, engagements and a whole lot more.

On the other hand, this program very capably initiated and coordinated by David and Kirsten is not for the faint-hearted volunteer mentor. There have been times long after the drive when I eventually close my eyes to sleep that I still see sessions such as motoring through the Hills at night with guard rails whizzing by centimetres from the place from where I sit, as well as times when I wish there had been an additional brake to push to the floor when things suddenly appear pear shaped. However, without the opportunity to offer my participation in the program and the program's capacity to make a difference, these youth would face even greater challengers in life. This indeed is an awesome program that empowers so many well into the future!

I hold onto these thoughts as well as I can in the face of ongoing challenges, knowing that this program, irrespective of my involvement has had and will have well into the future, a powerful impact.
