- Guides help young people develop understanding of the value of volunteering
- Major way of communication is non-verbal but communication technologies do not allow this.
- Guides develop communication opportunities and skills
- Wellness programs for girls in schools
- Crochet plastic bags into mats for homeless
- Girl Guides are the third family.
- Girl led projects that are initiated by girls
- Leadership skills
- No age limit
- Develop skills for workforce building selfesteem.
- Campsites –properties that age. One at Nuriootpa / Light Pass that needs some work
- Girls under guardianship see Guides as family and meeting need for belonging and acceptance
