Guest Speaker: Rob Eley—Legacy

- Legacy is an iconic and uniquely Australian charity dedicated to the care of widows and dependents of veterans, as well as those families of ADF personnel killed in hazardous service, training or peacekeeping operations
- It is the only organization of its kind in the world
- Affectionately known as Australia's biggest family
- Tradition of caring over 96 years reaches out to thousands of Australian widows, families and children of soldiers who lost their lives of health during or following service in all conflicts since WW1 to Iraq
- Support and service now extend to include the dependents of members of today's Australian Defence Force who lose their lives or their health as a results of or after their military service
- With the help of a group of dedicated volunteers, known as Legetees, Legacy currently support around 52000 widows, children and dependents
- In South Australia and Broken Hill, Legacy currently supports 4,468 widows and 151 children and dependents
- The Legacy Badge is a symbol of a proud Australian tradition spanning decades which continues to make a big impact on veteran's family today

- Legacy stands at the ready for every Australian Defence family, helping them rebuild their lives, as it has done since 1923
- In 2020 one of Australia's longest tradition, Legacy Week is as important as ever
