## **Guest Speaker:** Jade Hancock-RYLA 2021

- Day 1 of RYLA was named “Engagement” and consisted of a keynote, an activity titled leading your passion and a discussion on expectations throughout RYLA.
- Day 2 was titled ‘collaboration’ and I would like to think of this day as the day where we started to make genuine friendships with each other.
- Day 3 was titled “Understanding” and consisted of sessions to help us develop our skills in supporting a team and conflict management. There was also an ethics panel where we could submit ethical questions and a panel of experts would answer them through discussion. This panel really made me think about not only my understanding of ethics but also what my values were and how these values would align or clash with the values of the people around me.
- Day 4 was called ‘empowerment’ with a focus on the values workshop and physical activities. Through these activities there were opportunities to reflect on ourselves as individuals and times for us to work collaboratively and have fun out in the sunshine
- Day 5 was called ‘Introspection’ and consisted of activities where we learnt about communication styles and had opportunities to be creative in a variety of ways
- Day 6 was called ‘impact’ and focussed on a self-defence session
- Day 7 – our final day together – was appropriately titled ‘reflection’: Nothing Lasts Forever.

- Whilst RYLA can’t last forever, we all have to go back to our lives, to our routine, to work and to Uni. The things that will last forever are the memories, and the lessons, and the experiences. And from these experiences and with all the new knowledge I gained by participating in RYLA I could come back into my communities within Gawler now understanding what I can do to be a better leader
- During the two activities, advocacy and life after RYLA, we started to think about everything we had learnt throughout RYLA and this new knowledge would aid in our futures when we returned to our societies and communities. We reflected on how we would return to our communities as better, more confident leaders
