Wheels in Motion: David Weatherley

Wheels in Motion has returned!

Not able to operate during the recent COVID-19 restrictions Wheels in Motion Gawler returned to the streets on Monday 15th June.

A number of the participants were able to complete some hours during COVID restrictions but the majority will be returning and eager to finish their 75 hours supervised driving.

Wheels in Motion allows young people (17 - 25) in Gawler the opportunity to overcome a major barrier to employment and further education, by assisting them access to driver experience, enabling them to qualify for their P's.

This program targets young people who:

- Live/work/study in the Gawler and Light areas
- Do not have an accessible, appropriate vehicle in the household where they live
- Do not have access to a licensed supervising driver
- Can demonstrate that being P licensed would immediately improve their employment or education opportunities will receive some priority
- Pay a small fee to help us offset costs.

The mentors, who freely give of their time, sit in the vehicle and supervise the learner driver as they undertake these hours are a vital part of the service and we are always on the lookout for willing mentors.

Since the program commenced in July 2018, we have supported over 35 young people in achieving their 75 hours.

This has enabled these people to improve their employment opportunities, with another gaining employment and other attending further education.

Overall though the gaining of independence as a result of having a licence has been highlighted by the participants as the most positive outcome.

Wheels in Motion Gawler Inc. is also a registered benevolent organisation registered for charity tax concessions and designated gift recipient therefore anybody or business looking to donate to the program can claim a tax deduction.





A Past Project: The Dental Caravan

One of the Rotary Club of Gawler Light's earliest projects was a Dental Caravan that was sent to the Rotary Club of Mabalacat in RY 2000-2001.

For 5 years, it was parked in front of the Mabalacat City Hall, where the local Club conducted free circumcision surgery every school break, and free dental services to the residents every week.

Then the caravan was moved to Barangay Northville 16 resettlement to serve the dental needs of the resi-

> dents. The Rotary Community Corp of Northville 16 managed the project.

Then in 2010, the caravan was affixed to the structure of the Public Library of Mabalacat that the Club did as a matching grant project, within the compound of Mabalacat Elementary School. It was already too costly to move it around.

The caravan was used for the medical-dental-surgical

missions of the Club: medical check up of kids and adults with medicines dispensed, dental treatment, minor surgery on cysts, circumcision, and hub for the gathering of the club members.

Sometime in 2015, the principal of the school was changed, a city resolution moved for the expansion of the school that affected the location of the public library and the medical caravan. When the construction started the next year, the caravan was detached and donated to Rotary Community Corp of Northville 16 to be used for whatever need they desired. By that time, all equipment inside were no longer serviceable. With only the structure remaining, the RCC converted the caravan into a livelihood storage.

The dentist member who kept the medical caravan running died of diabetes sometime in 2015.

This was certainly a very worthwhile project.
